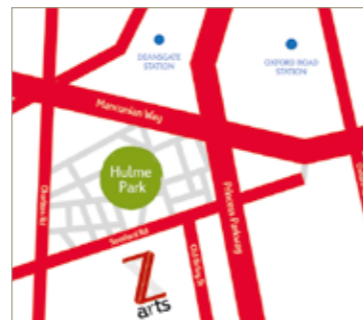

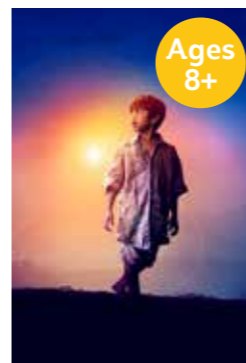
Festival Launch

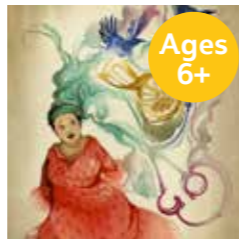

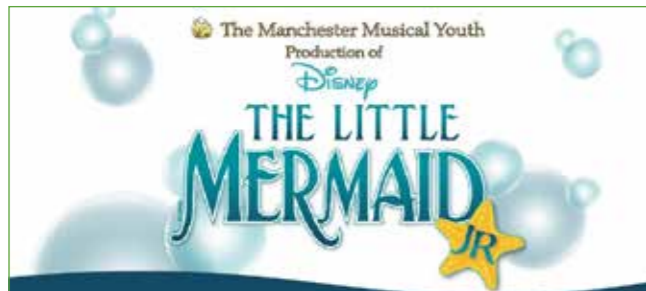
