What to expect -

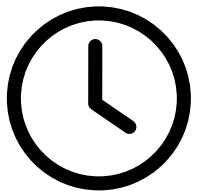
French comedian Marcel Lucont invites children to play a series of games as part of a gameshow to win a certificate of awfulness.
